***Odysseus Unbound* Seminar at the New Theatre**

On October 21 at 19:00 Robert Bittlestone, Professor James Diggle and Professor John Underhill will present a seminar at the New Theatre, Lixouri on the geological, classical and archaeological discoveries of *Odysseus Unbound: The Search for Homer's Ithaca*.

The seminar will be illustrated throughout with slides and computer animations and the content is aimed at a non-specialist audience. The talk will be delivered simultaneously in Greek and English.

The setting of Lixouri is especially appropriate for this subject as this western land mass of Paliki constitutes the area described within *Odysseus Unbound* as the most likely location for Homer's description in the *Odyssey* of the ancient island of Ithaca.

There is no charge for the seminar. Afterwards there will be an opportunity to meet the authors and to relax over a complimentary drink. The book will be on sale in the foyer and the authors will be available to sign copies.

Booking for dinner afterwards is not necessary: the town square of Lixouri is supported by many cafés and the adjacent marine parade is catered for by numerous restaurants.
